Victorian Christmas Carols

Jingle Bells, Jingle Bells, Jingle all the way! What better way to get in the spirit of the season than by singing some of the old classics. Jingle Bells is just one of those which the Victorians wrote and sang with hearty spirit. They were very much into writing songs which sounded and felt joyful while at the same time reviving and altering those which were more from the medieval period.

Some were intended more for family and friends' gatherings and some more religious in nature for church and choir purposes. Silent night was a well-known favourite that used to be sung during the Victorian era. Just another few songs the Victorians created or modified are Away in a Manger, and We Three Kings. Instruments used would have been pipes, drums, and voices!

The practice of caroling originated from the ancient English custom of travelling house to house as they sang to get the return of food. Modern times have romanticized caroling a bit, but it is still a very welcome sight to see at various seasonal events. Sadly, the practice of going house to house seems to have become a rarity these days.

Of course, another carol that shouldn't be forgotten is A Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens. Not of the singing kind but a literary classic of its own. Published in December 1843, it became an instant bestseller. Since then, it has been reprinted countless times, reinvented into movies and stage productions, and for some has become in one way or another a Christmas tradition.


